Other types of certifications include the Certified Management Accountant (CMA) and Enrolled Agent (EA with the IRS). Opportunities in industry range from corporate accounting departments to president of the corporation. Many of the presidents of resort properties in Las Vegas are accountants. - ♦ Minimum C (2.0) grade required in the prerequisite in order to continue with subsequent courses. Minimum C grade required to satisfy degree requirements.
- ♦ Admission to the major required to enroll in upper-division business courses.
- ♦ Lee Business School's Course-Repeat Policy: Students may take business courses a maximum of three times for degree applicability. For upper-division accounting (300-400-level ACC) classes, the three attempts include: grades earned, withdrawals and audits.
- ♦ Students should apply for graduation at least two semesters prior to their expected graduation date. Please see MyUNLV to initiate graduation and speak with your advisor about eligibility.
